



Golf Attire

Recognized golf attire worn correctly is expected.

Not Permitted

- Slops, sandals, or shoes with metal spikes
- Rugby socks or rolled down long socks
- T-Shirts
- Denim jeans or shorts and athletic shorts

In the Club House

Golfers and visitors are requested to dress in a manner befitting the surroundings and atmosphere provided in the club. We would prefer that gentlemen remove their hats.

General Code of Conduct

Do not feed the baboons.

Slow play is not acceptable. Keep up with the group ahead of yours. If your group falls behind, you may be asked by the course marshal to skip a hole.

Please repair all pitch marks on the green and rake bunkers.

Loud music is not acceptable.

Please do not stand on the back of the carts.

LOCAL RULES

Out of Bounds (Rule 2.1)

A ball is out of bounds when all the ball lies:

- Outside the perimeter of the course
- Within the walls of the Club House and the Veranda
- In the course maintenance area
- Beyond any line of white stakes.

Player Responsible for Handicap on Scorecard Model Local Rule L-2

Model Local Rule L-2 is in effect. The player is responsible for showing their Playing handicap on the scorecard.

Immovable Obstructions (Rule 16)

Relief is available under Rule 16.1a.for.

- Immovable obstructions, i.e., cart paths, bridges, artificial hardened road surfaces and all small fences with stone chips
- All areas marked GUR.

There is no relief from flower beds.

Sprinkler Heads

All sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions. In addition, if a ball lies on a closely mown area, within two club lengths of a sprinkler head, which itself is within two club lengths of the putting green and it interferes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the ball may be dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay, which is not nearer the hole, avoids interference and is not on the putting green

Penalty Areas (Rule 17.1)

Hole1.

The forest bisecting the first fairway is considered a Yellow Penalty Area. The area is marked by yellow stakes and continues up the right-hand side of the "b" fairway as far as the first bunker. Should a shot played (other than your tee shot) land in this area you may, as an extra relief option and with a penalty of one shot, proceed to the designated drop zone. If a player does not know whether their ball is in the penalty area described above, the player may play a provisional ball under Rule 18.3 which is modified in this way:

In playing the provisional ball, the player may use the stroke and distance relief option (Rule 17.1d.1) the back on the line relief option (Rule 17.1d.2). The player may also use the drop zone. Once the player has played a provisional ball under this local rule, they may not use any further options under Rule 17.1 in relation to the original ball. For full clarification of this local rule, please see R&A Official Rules of Golf, Model Local Rules B-3 Provisional Ball for Ball in a Penalty area. Note if your **tee shot** comes to rest in this Penalty area you must proceed as outlined in rule 17.1 and the drop zone may not be used.

Hole 2.

If your tee shot lands in the water, this is a Red Penalty Area however you may as an extra relief option and with a penalty of one shot, proceed to the designated drop zone.

NB the hazard ends at the last red stake and does not include any area short of the water from the tee. Any ball landing outside of the area thus described is a lost ball and the player must proceed under Rule 18.

Preferred Lies Model Local Rule E-3

Model Local Rule E-3 is in effect. When any part of a player's ball touches part of the general area cut to fairway height or less (including drop zones), the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball or another ball within one open score card length from the original ball, in the general area and not nearer the hole and play from this relief area. In proceeding under this Local Rule, the player must choose a spot to place the ball and use the procedures for replacing a ball under Rule 14.2b(2) and Rule 14.2e

Bunkers (Rule 12)

Any artificial bunker revetting is deemed to be an integral part of the course and free relief is not available.

Any visible drainage pipe in the bunker may be treated as an abnormal course condition and relief taken under Rule 16.1c.
